Raja Narendra Lal Khan Women's College (Autonomous) was established in the historical Gope Palace of Midnapore in the year 1957. Gope Palace, during the period of Raja Debendra Lal Khan was an important site of freedom movement and was graced by the footprints of stalwarts like Gandhiji, Netaji and Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru. The father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi visited this palace twice in the years 1921 and 1925. ## Rules and Regulations

Admission to the College implies an undertaking by the students to the effect that the students shall try their utmost to enhance the reputation of the college and shall willingly abide by the rules and disciplines of the college.

- Online Admission System has been launched from the session 2015-2016
- Applications are to be submitted through online process only.
- Candidates should log-on college website: www.rnlkwc.ac.in.
- Guidelines for submissions of online applications are given on the website under "online admission" button.
- Merit lists will be published on the website.
- Admission will be online based on the Merit.
- If one wants to cancel admission, it should be done within seven days of admission, otherwise the entire fees paid will be forfeited. Admission cancellation fees $=$ Rs. 1000.00.
- Admission may be cancelled at any point of time if the information provided by the applicants are found to be false.
- After the commencement of classes, the students will be required to bring the following documents for verification.
- Mark sheet of H.S or equivalent exam from Board or Council.
- Mark sheet of M.P. or equivalent exam from Board.
- Age proving certificate (Admit card of Madhyamik or equivalent exam / Certificate of Madhyamik exam).
- Caste certificate, if any.
- 2 copies of Pass port size photographs (scanned copy within 30 kb in jpg format)
- Pass and character certificate from the Head of the Institution where she studied last.
[Photocopies of all the above said documents are also to be brought at the time of verification.]
- Applications for Hostel Seat would be submitted by the candidates after having their admission.
- Residential certificate mentioning the approximate distance from the residence to the college from relevant authority.
- Parent's income certificate from the relevant authority.
- Mark sheet of H.S. or equivalent exam.
- Hostel seats will be allotted through proper selection procedure on the basis of the seats available.
- The student migrating from another University or Board may be provisionally admitted on payment of Migration Fee.

Admission rules are followed as per U.G.C., State Govt. \& University guidelines.

## Rules and Regulations of the College

1. Admission fees are not generally refundable once admitted in the college.
2. All the students of the college must collect identity cards from the office and must come to the college with their respective identity cards being duly signed by the student and countersigned by the Principal of the college.
3. Discipline should be maintained in the college campus.
4. Uniform: Our College uniform is saffron bordered white saree and white blouse or white Salwar Kameez with saffron Dupatta with college logo. Students must wear their uniform on Thursdays and on special occasions without fail.
5. Use of mobile phone in the college campus including class rooms is prohibited.
6. After admission, a student has to attend minimum $75 \%$ of total classes held as per Hon'ble Supreme Court order.
7. Minimum 75\% attendance should be maintained to take part in the Internal Assessment Examination/s.
8. No day-scholar will generally be allowed to leave the campus on week days before 3.45 p.m.

The Palace has an underground which is now used as Museum. It was formed in the year 2012 at the corner of the basement of palace/College office of Raja N.L. Khan Women's College with the financial help of Rs. 50000/-from the UGC-CPE fund. The things
 which have been kept in the Museum are of different types. Most of the things are related to Raja of Narajole. Besides this, replica of sculptures bought from the Indian Museum, Kolkata are also displayed in the underground.

Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru, Subhas Chandra Bose put their holy footsteps in this Palace. Heritage Commission of West Bengal declared this Palace as 'Heritage Building'.

From the last session the college has taken an initiative to use the non-conventional sources of energy, a step to combat the present global warming situation. Solar power plants have been installed at our college campus for the purpose of the students especially for hostel boarders.
Hostel bathrooms are provided with solar geysers that supply hot water whenever required.


## $>$ Water ATM:

Dept. of Public Health Engineering, Govt. of West Bengal, granted us Water ATM for providing Arsenic free clean and purified drinking water to our students and staff at very low cost, one liter of purified water costs only Rs.1/- . Hon'ble Minister, Sri Subrata Mukherjee, Dept. of Public Health Engineering and Panchayet\& Rural Development, inaugurate this automated Water ATM on 14th October, 2017.

## > Cultural Activities :

The college possesses a very rich cultural Heritage. Various competitions like Music, Debate, Dancing, Elocution, Drawings, Quiz etc. are held regularly. The college arranges several cultural programmes throughout the year. Teachers and students participate actively in all cultural activities.


## $>$ Games and Sports :

The college has nice infrastructural facilities for different kinds of Indoor and Outdoor games. Students regularly participate in Inter College, State level \& National level competitions. Annual sports is organised with pomp and grandeur. Last year the students of the college participated in Govt. Athletics Meet, Badminton Championship and University Meet. Our student, Ms. Sarmila Ahir won 3rd Prize in Long-jump in the Govt. Athletics Meet, 2016. It's our pleasure the student Ejmire Khatun, B.A. (Gen.) 2nd year achieved Gold \& Bronze Medal in World MAC Game in Kung-fu.


## N.C.C. :

There is one National Cadet Corps (NCC) unit in our college with cadet strength of 160 girls in the present session (2017-18) functioning under 6 Bengal Girls (I) Coy, NCC. Cadets undergo an intensive training course which includes both institutional training and camp training. Apart from participating in Combined Annual training camps (CATC), every year cadets participate in various prestigious camps like Republic Day camp, Thal Sena camp, Trekking camp, Basic and Advanced leadership camp, Army and Hospital Attachment camp, Personality Development camp etc. Cadets also participate in various social and community development programmes throughout the year. After completion of two year successful training, cadets appear in ' B ' certificate examination and at the end of third year they appear in ' C ' certificate examination. A large number of Ex-NCC cadets have joined in West Bengal Police Service. The college has its own NCC Firing Range for the NCC cadets.


## $>$ N.S.S. :

The college has four National Service Scheme (N.S.S) units with 400 volunteers and four programme officers. Different awareness programmes on Thalasemia, National Integration, Skin care, Rights of Women, HIV/AIDS, Dengue, Law awareness and Save the Girl Child etc. are conducted throughout the year. Numbers of activities are also carried out in the last session, some of programmes conducted by NSS units are plantation of 100 saplings in the college campus, Thalasemia testing of 400 college students, blood donation camp ( 75 units of blood donated by students, staff and teachers), campus cleaning, organisation of quiz on 'Life and concepts of Swami Vivekananda and National and International Contemporary Affairs', conduction of sit and draw competition and arrangement of sports events among the students of Gope Primary School (the adopted village of N.S.S), 7days special winter camp, cultural programme etc. The units also celebrated the different important days like Independence Day, Republic Day, N.S.S. day, Rabindra Jayanti, Netaji's Birthday etc. The college has received best NSS Unit Award from Vidyasagar University in the last session and two NSS volunteers of this college attended National Camp in Agra.


## Museum of the Department of History :

This historical museum is maintained by the Department of History, on "The Role of Midnapore in Indian Freedom Movement". This Museum has been formed in the year 2008 to exhibit the role of Midnapore in the Indian freedom movement. In this museum, there are thirteen sculptures depicting the important milestones of the role of Midnapore in the Indian freedom movement. Again numerous rare photographs of Women who participated in this movement with their biography are also displayed here.


## > Folk Museum

Folk Museum has been set up in 2014 by the active initiation of Bengali Department with financial assistance from college authority. Various Folk artifacts have been collected from indigenous Folk-artists and displayed in the Museum. It helps to make the students aware of the traditional value of this locality. Apart from our students and teachers, common visitors are also allowed in specific date and time.

## $>$ Gurukul:

Gurukul of Sanskrit department is a combination of traditional as well as modern education system of India. It remembers our ancient learning system of India. Here the students sit at the feet of the teachers and receive education. There are some ancient manuscripts, instruments for vedic rituals, LCD projector etc. For the enhancement of knowledge of the students.

## > CD Gallery:

Dept. of Political Science maintains a CD Gallery. It contains a wide variety of CDs on different topics e.g. Freedom movement, Oscar wining films etc.

## > Mathematics Gallery :

Mathematical gallery has been set up in the Department of Mathematics. An innovative teaching aid has been initiated. It creates a unique learning experience.

## Book Talk:

Book Talk is one of the special extension activities of the Central Library. It consists of two parts, a talk based on any popular book for 15 minutes followed by an interactive session of 10 minutes. The Talk has become very popular among the teachers and students in a very short period since its initiation. Currently the Central Library is organizing the talk weekly.

- Seminar Library: Besides the Central Library, all the Departments have a seminar library of their own. Students can borrow few extra books from these departmental collections. Presently the total number of books of the seminar libraries is nearly 9000.


## $>$ Hostel :

- The college Hostel provides a homely atmosphere for our borders. At present we have 437 seats in five hostels viz. Sarada Bhaban, Bhagabati Bhaban, Rashmani Chhatriniwas, Pravabati Bhaban, Nivedita Bhaban and Matangini Bhaban in the College campus.
- We provide facilities for our hostel boarders such as - spacious room with generator power supply in power failure, Solar hot water, aqua guard, indoor \& outdoor game place and equipments, Medical facilities etc.
- We have keen attention for security and discipline for our students. No boarder will be allowed to remain outside of the hostel after 6.00 p.m. They may leave the hostel on Saturday after college hours \& on Sunday between $7.00 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and $11.00 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and between 2.00 p.m. and 6.00 p.m. But they return before college hours on Monday or before 6.30 p.m. on Sunday. None will be allowed to meet the boarders except those, whose name have been included in the visitors list. In emergent cases the superintendent may give a special permission even to those who are not recognized as visitors on production of a letter of permission from the guardian.


## Canteen :

The college has two canteens with all facilities. Meals, Tiffin, snacks, tea and soft-drinks are always available fresh for our students in affordable prices.

## Play ground-gymnasium-indoor court :

As the college campus is very wide and spacious, we have our own playground with gallery within the campus boundary walls. We arrange Annual Sports Meet there.

## $\rightarrow$ Auditorium and Seminar Hall :

- Auditorium

With a seating capacity of 2000 people, a state of the art Auditorium is ready to host academic and cultural events of the College. Needless to say that, the auditorium adds a new feather to the cap of this patrician college.

- Seminar Hall (Rabindraneer)

Rabindraneer, the seminar hall which was inaugurated in 1997, has been renovated currently. And it has become a well decorated and centrally airconditioned seminar hall with a very large seating capacity.


## $>$ E-learning facilities :



One e-learning Laboratory has been set up beside the Central Library There are twenty computers for the use of students for Hands-on computer classes. It helps the Staff to have their account for online access through INFLIBNET. Students are given access to e-learning laboratory for reference work and to enhance communicative skills

## $>$ Language Lab :

The college has to its credit two well-equipped Language Laboratories under the aegis of Department of English to run the audio-visual mode of conducting communicative English. It has up-to-date software installed for each user separately. It significantly enhances the teaching-learning process. The students are also facilitated through the screening of movies
 based on their texts.

## > Spoken English Course:

To have a strong foundation in Communicative English is an unspoken truth for the students of this generation to compete in the outer field to establish a place of their own. That is why a six-month Communicative English course is mandatory for every student of all departments from the session 2015-2016. Department of English conducts this course in audio-visual mode with the help of Language Laboratory. A certificate is also issued at the end of the course.

## $>$ Animal House :

The College has a newly constructed Animal House in the Campus and we have the Institutional Animal Ethics Committee (IAEC) guided by CPCSEA, Ministry of Environment, Govt. of India. The motto is to maintain and care of animal specially rats, for research purposes.


## $>$ Aqua-cultural Pond :

A project to preserve the indigenous fish species has been carried out under the financial support from DBT Star. One large pond and four breeding ponds have been constructed for this purpose within the college premise. The whole project is supervised by Dept. of Zoology of the college. Aquaculture is breeding, raising, and harvesting fish, shellfish, and aquatic plants. Basically, aquaculture serve as an environment friendly source of food and commercial products, helps to create healthier habitats, and is used to rebuild stocks of threatened or endangered species. In addition to this, ponds maintain soil moisture in their vicinity thereby conserving natural resources.

## > Historical Museum in Basement of the Palace :

The role of Narajole Raj in the Indian Freedom Movement and their glorious family background has been displayed in the basement of the palace. We have collected 21 pictures of Narajole Raj family members depicting various movements organized by them and also collected some historical pottery utensils used by them. The replica of historical sculptures and old coins have increased the importance of this museum.

## > Ramp and Elevator:

In recent years, a numbers of ramps have been constructed by the College authority in each building for easy movements of the physically challenged students. Moreover, with the same objective, an elevator has been installed near the Central Library two years back.


## $>$ Remedial and Entry into Service Scheme :

Classes under Remedial and Entry into service schemes are conducted as per U.G.C guidelines on the basis of the availability of the fund provided from U.G.C. specially for the slow learners and students from backward classes. Special remedial classes are arranged for the slow learners. Supplementary examinations are also organized for the unsuccessful students at the end of their current semester examination and special classes are also taken for these students.

## > Wi-Fi Zone :

In the continuous process of learning we provide internet facility with wi fi service. Students can access e learning \& reading materials from various education related web sites.

## $>$ Health Facilities:

- In the college hostel one registered doctor is available twenty four hours. On emergency basis the doctor is also available for the day-scholars and one Gynaecologist visit one day in a week for Hostel Boarders.
- Each department has the First-Aid facilities.
- The college has signed up a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with St. Joseph Hospital in 2016. The students and staffs will get two free health check-up per year and also they will get $25 \%$ and $20 \%$ discount respectively on treatment and pathological testing.
- One health unit with doctor and other medical facilities is available in the college premise.



## $>$ Students-aid-fund:

Poor and meritorious students of the college may get the full or half free (only Tuition Fee) from students-aidfund contributed by the teaching staff.

## > Cycle Stand :

A newly constructed cycle stand has been offered to the students from 2017-2018 session. It has capacity to place 1000 cycles in proper order.

The College also provides the residential facilities to its staff by providing two Non-Teaching and eight Teaching Staff quarters.

## $>$ Guest House :

A well-furnished guest house is provided by the college to welcome the guests.

## $>$ Anti-ragging Committee and Squad :

Ragging is a crime, condemned by nation. To make the campus ragging free the Anti Ragging Cell constituted of the Anti-Ragging Committee and the Anti-Ragging Squad is in force in the college in strict compliance with the "UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institution, 2009".

Objectives :

- The Anti-Ragging Cell, to prohibit and eliminate the scourge of ragging including any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student or indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any students or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student which has the effect of generating a sense of shame, or torture or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or any other student aware of the demoralising effect of ragging and the approach of the institution towards those indulging in ragging.
- Keeps a continuous vigil over the important corners of the campus vulnerable to incidence of ragging specially the Hostels.
- Assures the students to deal with the incident of ragging stringently brought to its notice.
- Send the clear message that ragging in any form shall not be tolerated.

Promotes healthy interaction between the freshers, junior students and senior students.

## > Sexual Harassment Cell :

As per the guidelines of UGC and the Supreme Court an Anti Sexual Harassment Cell has been established by the college to provide a healthy and congenial atmosphere to the staff and the students of the college. The cell was constituted to meet the basic objectives

- To develop the guidelines and norms for a policy against sexual harassment.
- To develop principles and procedures for combating sexual harassment.
- To work out details for the implementation of the policy.
- To prepare a detailed plan of action, both short and long term.
$>$ Grievance Cell :
The function of the cell is to look into the complaints lodged by any student, and judge its merit. The Grievance cell is also empowered to look into matters of harassment. Anyone with a genuine grievance may approach the department members in person, or in consultation with the officer in-charge Students' Grievance Cell. In case the person is unwilling to appear in self, grievances may be dropped in writing at the letterbox/ suggestion box of the Grievance Cell at Administrative Block. Grievances may also be sent through e-mail to the officer in-charge of Students' Grievance Cell.
Objectives:
The objective of the Grievance Cell is to develop a responsive and accountable attitude among all the stakeholders in order to maintain a harmonious educational atmosphere in the institute.
A Grievance Cell should be constituted for the redressal of the problems reported by the Students of the College with the following objectives:
- Upholding the dignity of the College by ensuring strife free atmosphere in the College through promoting cordial Student-Student relationship and Student-teacher relationship etc.
- Encouraging the Students to express their grievances / problems freely and frankly, without any fear of being victimized.
- Suggestion / complaint Box is installed in front of the Administrative Block in which the Students, put in writing their grievances and their suggestions for improving the Academics / Administration in the College.
- Advising Students of the College to respect the right and dignity of one another and show utmost restraint and patience whenever any occasion of rift arises.
- Advising all the Students to refrain from inciting Students against other Students, teachers and College administration
- Advising all staffs to be affectionate to the Students and not behave in a vindictive manner towards any of them for any reason.


## Procedure for lodging complaint:

- The students may feel free to put up a grievance in writing/or in the format available in the admin dept. and drop it in boxes
- The Grievance Cell will act upon those cases which have been forwarded along with the necessary documents.
- The Grievance Cell will assure that the grievance has been properly solved in a stipulated time limit provided by the cell.


## > Railway Concession :

Willing students are to submit fees book and card to the concerned office staff within 15th of every month to avail this concession.

## > Students' Common Room :

Our College also has a spacious student's Common room for some recreations of students in their leisure with various journals, newspapers, books, TV and provisions for different indoor-games and various co-curricular activities.

## > Equal Opportunity Cell:

Emphasis to the deprived groups for learning and creating space for them to mainstream themselves is the job of equal Opportunity Cell and the cell runs specific scheme of coaching for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, OBC (non-creamy layer \& Minorities in order to enhance the employability and success and to reveal idea of social justice and equality. The cell has been working very effectively from the last session. Seminars, Workshops and Lectures are also arranged at regular intervals.

## $>$ Women's Cell:

For gender equality and gender justice in all its intervention and practices Woman Grievance Redressal Cell was established under the Act No. 20 of 1990 of Govt. of India. The College has established a Women Cell in the college campus for the women faculty, staff and girl students, to enhance understanding of issues related to women and to make the college campus a safe place for them. Women's cell of our college celebrates Women's Day every year. This year on Women's Day the Hon'ble SP of Paschim Medinipur. Smt. Bharati Ghosh was felicitated. There was a wonderful interaction between Smt. Ghosh and our students.

## $>$ Study in India :

The college has been selected for Study in India programme under MHRD, Govt. of India. We have received an international student from Bangladesh in the last year.

## Activities of the College

## New Proposal for Practical Component of Environmental Studies:

Environmental studies is a compulsory paper (Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course) for all the students of the 2nd Semester. In this paper, 40 marks is allotted for the Practical work. To involve the students more actively in the environmental protection activities, the college authority has introduced a slightly different structure regarding the practical component of the environmental studies paper. According to the proposal, the entire students of the second semester have been divided into 23 groups, 13groups comprising the Arts students and 10 groups encompassing the Science students. The Arst groups are identified as A-1, A$2 \ldots$.whereas the science groups are recognized as $S-1, S-2 \ldots$ and each group has been given nearly 10000 sq ft area within the college campus to perform various eco-friendly activities. The plots are distributed among the 23 groups by the process of lottery. Each group works under the mentorship of three teachers and/or non teaching staff. The students keep the records of their day-to day contribution to bring significant changes in the plot allotted to them. Marks will be given to the students according their joint contributions as well as their individual contribution.

## $>$ Seminar organisation

Seminars are of great importance. Seminars are capable of keeping the students updated with the technologies. It provides latest information about the things which are happening in science and technology. Students cannot improve their knowledge from textbooks alone. In this context several departments of our college organize several National and International seminar in regular basis every year.
