Our college began its journey from the historical Gope Palace with a handful of students, with the unstinting support and encouragement of Dr Bidhan Chandra Roy, the-then Chief Minister of West Bengal. The following is a comprehensive overview of the activities and initiatives undertaken by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Raja Narendralal Khan Women's College throughout the academic year [2023-2024], categorized according to the seven criteria of NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council).

1. Curricular Aspects

1.1. Faculty Development Programs (FDPs)

- **Food Components and Community Health and Research Initiation** (August 8-13, 2023): In collaboration with the Departments of Nutrition and Microbiology, this program aimed to enhance faculty understanding of community health and research initiation at the undergraduate level.
- **Research in Humanities and Social Sciences** (August 8-13, 2023): Conducted by the Department of English along with IQAC, this FDP focused on integrating research methodologies and practices into the humanities and social sciences.

- **Frontiers in Scientific Computing** (August 23-28, 2023): Organized by the Departments of Mathematics, Computer Science, and Physics with IQAC, this FDP covered advancements in AI, MATLAB, LATEX, security, and PYTHON.

1.2. Alumni Lecture Series: Plans were discussed to conduct an Alumni Lecture Series, featuring distinguished alumni to provide students with insights into various fields and enhance industry connections. More than 18 departments have organised the Alumni Lecture Series for the year 2023-2024.

2. Teaching-Learning and Evaluation

2.1. Faculty Development

- **FDP Requirement:** It was decided that every faculty member, including SACT, must engage in at least one FDP per year, with a one-year gap between attended FDPs. FDPs on Communicative Hindi will be organized by IQAC in the academic session 2024-2025 to improve language skills among faculty members.

3. Research, Innovations, and Extension

3.1. Promotion of Research Activities

- **Incentive and Support: Awards for Excellence in Research and Publications:** The IQAC proposed and received approval for several awards including the Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy Award, Sir Acharya Jagdish Chandra Bose Award, Sir Acharya Prafulla Chandra Roy Award, and the Dr. Bibha Chowdhuri Faculty Seed Money Award. These awards aim to recognize and incentivize exceptional research and publication achievements by faculty members. The recipients of the various awards for 2022 and 2024 were selected by the Principal and the Director, R & D Cell of the college after receiving applications from faculties. Steps will be taken to enhance research infrastructure and provide support to researchers.

3.2. Scopus Subscription

- **Discussion for Procurement:** The importance of subscribing to Scopus to improve research perception was acknowledged. The Research Committee will further discuss and take necessary actions regarding this subscription.

4. Infrastructure and Learning Resources

4.1. Library and Resource Enhancements

- **CCTV Installation:** The purchase procedure for installing CCTV in the Library Circulation Section was initiated to enhance security.
- **Proposal for Scopus Subscription:** The acquisition of a Scopus subscription for the library to improve research resources and accessibility.
- **RFID installation:** It was decided to have RFID enabled Gate in the Library.

4.2. Environmental Initiatives

- **Rainwater Harvesting:** Installation of a rainwater harvesting system to manage water resources sustainably.
- **Procurement of Bio-Stoves and Colour-Coded Dustbins:** Introduction of bio-stoves for sustainable cooking and color-coded dustbins for efficient waste segregation.

5. Student Support and Progression

5.1. Tele-MANAS Helpline

- **Awareness Campaign:** All mentors were informed to promote the Tele-MANAS helpline, and it was displayed on the electronic notice board to provide mental health support to students.

5.2. Divyangjan Initiatives

- **User-Friendly Measures:** Initiatives were taken to enhance accessibility and support for Divyangjan students, faculty, and staff, including improved campus facilities and support services.

5.3. Provision of Lady Doctor

- **Health Support:** The proposal to provide a Lady Doctor for hostel boarders and other students was discussed to ensure medical support and well-being.

6. Governance, Leadership, and Management

6.1. Committee Formation and Strategic Decisions

- **SEDG Committee:** Formation of the SEDG (Socio-Economically Disadvantaged Groups) Committee to address the needs of disadvantaged students.
- **Environmental Management:** Implementing strategies for solid waste management and environmental sustainability.

6.2. Staff Development

- **Advanced Computer Skills SDP:** Following up on the previous year's program, an advanced-level Staff Development Program on computer skills will be organized.

6.3. Self-Appraisal Submission

- **Faculty Requirements:** All faculty members are required to submit a Self-Appraisal by including an updated Faculty Profile and necessary documentation.

7. Institutional Values and Best Practices

7.1. Inclusivity and Accessibility

- **Braille Signage:** Installation of Braille signage to enhance campus navigation for visually impaired individuals.
- **Environmentally Friendly Practices:** Initiatives such as "No Fuel Run Vehicle Day," "No AC Day," and the procurement of an e-rickshaw promote sustainability and reduce the institution's carbon footprint.

7.2. Research and Community Engagement

- **Community Health Programs:** FDPs focusing on community health and research initiation reflect the institution's commitment to societal engagement and impact.

In summary, the IQAC's efforts over the past year have been instrumental in driving improvements across multiple dimensions of college life. By focusing on quality enhancement and best practices, it has successfully contributed to the institution's growth and development, positioning it for continued success in future endeavours.

Audit

Audit for the same years will be done after getting the date from the allotted Govt. Auditor. Internal audit for the year 2023-24 is in progress.

Different Distinctive Features of our College

Biodiversity Park

The Biodiversity Park has been set up inside the college campus with the administrative approval and financial sanction of Rupees Nine Lakh Eighty Thousand Four Hundred (Rs. 9,80,400.00) of the Dept. of Environment, Govt. of West Bengal last year. Recently, Amer-Sil Katex Pvt. Ltd. has donated Rupees 17 lakh for the construction of the Butterfly Garden. The park will function as an environmental education and conservation centre.

At present the initiative has the following components—

1. Restored eco-pond with indigenous fishes.
2. Wild habitat observation zone.
3. Conserved old Banyan tree.
4. Medicinal plant garden along with nursery.
5. Tropical Fruit orchard.
6. Interpretation Center supporting education and research work.

On 15th August 2023, the park was inaugurated by Dr. H. S. Debnath, Honourable Chairman, West Bengal Bio-diversity Board. Some groups of students and teachers from various educational institutions have visited our Bio-diversity Park in this session.

Solar Tree for Eco-friendly Energy

To support our commitment to sustainable and eco-friendly energy, our college campus now features a solar tree, thanks to the collaboration with Durgapur CMERI (Central Mechanical Engineering Research Institute). The solar tree was officially inaugurated by the District Magistrate of Paschim Medinipur on March 3, 2022. This advanced solar

tree installation, with a peak capacity of 11.55 kilowatts, features 35 solar photovoltaic panels, each delivering 330 watts. On an average sunny day, it generates between 35 and 45 units of clean energy. As of July 31, 2024, the solar tree has produced a total of 29,308 units of electricity, reflecting its significant contribution to our campus's renewable energy efforts. In the last year, the solar tree has generated a total of 12,815 units of electricity. The green energy produced by this system has led to a total reduction of 16,809 kg in carbon dioxide emissions, highlighting its positive environmental impact.

Construction of the Clock Tower

One of the strikingly major landmarks of our college is now the establishment of CLOCK TOWER on the top of the main entry gate in 2024. It has a specific type of structure that houses a turret clock on the pinnacle of the tower which has **four clocks** facing outside on the upper exterior walls. It rings as per the schedule of our classes. The installation has become possible from a large fund generously contributed by the Balaka Alumni Association of our College. The Clock Tower has Been officially inaugurated on 27th July 2024. We hope, our clock tower will also become famous for its for its accuracy of time and its massive bell.

Central Library

The Central Library of the College is one of the advanced College Libraries under the Vidyasagar University. It is fully automated with software Koha and DSpace. Recently RFID system (RFID-enabled circulation kiosk, smart gate, book drop box, etc.) has been installed to improve the services and security of the library. The library caters all kinds of intellectual and academic needs of the students and members of the teaching and non-teaching staff of the College to the fullest satisfaction of all concerned. The library has under its possession nearly **43950** books as on 30th June 2024. In addition, Rs. **1.5 lakh** have been spent to purchase new books in this year.

Banamahotsav

Like every year Banamahotsav has been successfully celebrated this year, too with the assistance of the Alumni Association “Balaka”, and the NSS of this college. 40 saplings have been planted inside the Biodiversity Park and more than 200 plants at various places of the campus. The programme was led by the principal of the college.

College Cooperative Credit Society

The Staff Credit Co-operative Society of Raja Narendralal Khan Women’s College has been working efficiently over the years for the welfare of the members of the co-operative society. At present, there are 112 members (Teaching Staff - 58, Non-Teaching Staff -29, and SACT- 25). During the last financial year 2023-24, the society has sanctioned a total loan amounting to Rs 91,60,000/- (Ninety One Lakh Sixty Thousand only).

College Land

The lease deed of college land has been extended by ADM & DLRO, Paschim Medinipur for 30 years from 22/08/2017.

Hostels

The College has six hostels at present. Nearly 500 boarders reside in these six hostels. Massive renovation work of the Pravabati Bhavan and Lavatories and electrical repairing works of all the buildings have been done. A big kitchen has been constructed for hostel boarders. One of the old kitchens has been transformed into the Hostel Common Room with all facilities.

Supply of Water in the Campus

The Supply of water in hostels, laboratories, and staff quarters is done by the Public Health Engineering Department, Govt. of West Bengal. This department supervises the pumping of water from a big well, situated at Gope Nandini at 1.5 K.M. from the college, and water is stored in a huge overhead reservoir inside the college campus, from which water is delivered. Besides, another deep tube-well was installed inside the campus. However, during the summer season, our college campus often faces scarcity

of water. The College Authority is grateful to Mr. Subrata Mukherjee, MIC, PHE & Panchayet and Rural Development for sanctioning of one deep tube-well and one Water ATM for this college. A water filter with capacity of 3000 lt. has been installed in the hostel last year with the assistance of the Dept. of Chemical Engineering, IIT, KGP, under the supervision of Prof. Sirsendu De. Two more water filters of 1500 lit. capacity mentioned above have been installed near Rabindra Neer and Controller Section this year.

Mentorship

During the session 2023-24, a total of 288 candidates, who had financial problems in their families, from different departments were given student concessions in different semesters. In the odd semester, 88 students and in the even semester a total of 200 students were considered the waiving of fees partially or fully.

College Annual Sports 2023-24

The Annual Athletic Meet, 2023 was held on 19 January 2024 at our college playground. Every year College organizes various intra-mural competitions of Carrom board, Badminton, Volleyball, Kho Kho, Cricket, and Football from 4 to 5 days before the annual athletic meet. Dr. Jayasree Laha, Principal of the College was present at the Inaugural function of the Annual Athletic Meet.

The whole playground had been decorated with colourful flags, buntings, and plastic cones a day earlier. Sitting arrangements for the guests and spectators were made under a large canopy. The separate sections for different events and track boundaries had been drawn with white lines. The principal arrived in time. She took the salute. The participants and N.C.C cadets participated in the march past. N.C.C Trainer led the march past. **Smt. Susoma Mahato**, the best athlete, 2022. **The Oath was read by Smt. Susoma Mahato**. An aerobic dance, drum performance, and callisthenic exercises were performed by the students of N.C.C and the Physical Education Department on the day. The sports started at 9.00 am. The principal madam hoisted the national flag with the band of the national anthem.

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A large number of participants were there in the 100 Mts. sprint. There were six heats then started long and high jumps. Simultaneously there were other events like the Shot-put, Javelin the Discus throw etc.

The members of district officials and college staff officiated the games and sports meet. The ‘Tug-Of-War’ was a very interesting game.
