15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary	
<p>As suggested by NEP, Raja Narendralal Khan Women's College [Autonomous] adheres to an interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary approach in all of its endeavors. The college is affiliated to Vidyasagar University where in syllabus of all programmes have been revised/redesigned in a phased manner to incorporate Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary courses as electives and are being proposed to students. Inter-disciplinary curricula, which allow students to choose from a variety of programs offered by the college, have been proposed in order to provide students with holistic academic growth. The institute uses a Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for all of its courses. Some of them also include topics like professional ethics, environmental studies, gender equality, socially relevant projects, and others that are based on values and the environment. All programmes are designed in such a way that students get maximum flexibility to choose elective courses offered by other Departments and are also encouraged to participate in MOOC through SWAYAM. One might say that the college is proactively pursuing execution of the ideas given in the NEP Rules and guarantees variety for all educational plan and teaching method technological advancements in educating and picking up, empowering sensible direction and development, decisive reasoning and imagination. Additionally, the college's IQAC organizes faculty education programs on the fundamental principles of NAAC, NIRF, and NEP. The college intends to offer vocational and short-term value-added courses in light of the</p>	

challenges students face. The point is to make the students prepared, so they don't have to depend on Government jobs only, however rather clear a way towards independent work. The College is attempting to identify the program learning outcomes, as well as the course and unit learning outcomes, that define the specific knowledge, skills, attitudes, and values that the learner will acquire and will ensure that each program achieves its goal as it prepares for a greater number of multidisciplinary subjects. In this regard, the College has also pioneered a number of initiatives, such as the establishment of two Research Centres—one in the Humanities and Social Sciences and one in the Natural and Applied Sciences—where interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary research is conducted alongside collaborative programs with other HEIs. Additionally, the college organizes an annual academic and cultural fest for both undergraduate and post-graduate students across various disciplines on unambiguous subjects consistently. The college also encourage collaborations across different departments while conducting seminars, conferences and workshops. Additionally, the College publishes a wide range of works, including the International Research Journal of Basic and Applied Science (ISSN 2455-6718) and "Anudhyan: An International Journal of Social Science" (ISSN 2455-6319) and an Annual Magazine, "Sanhita"; furthermore, various magazines and pamphlets by various departments.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Raja Narendralal Khan Ladies' School [Autonomous] affiliated with Vidyasagar University, will comply to the conventions and guidelines of Academic Bank Credit. The college is registered in the National Academic Depository, a government initiative to provide an online repository for all academic awards under the Digital India Programme. The NAD ID has been issued to the graduating semester students in the academic session of 2020-2021. The college is currently uploading student mark sheets and degree certificates via the nad.digitallocker.gov.in platform. The National Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) portal has now been integrated into the NAD portal <https://nad.digitallocker.gov.in> platform and is currently live from academic year 2021 onwards. All of the college's programs use a choice-based credit system (CBCS), and the Academic Council is currently working on a resolution about the ABC. As soon as the resolution is approved by higher academic bodies, it will formally register in the ABC portal. For this purpose, the college is in the process of creating centralised database of the college students and has established 100% e-administration in the

students' admission and examination modalities. e-administration in the understudies' confirmation and assessment modalities. The college has procured specific software modules for this purpose. Through this database, where in the academic credits earned by the student from various courses will be digitally stored so that the credit earned by student previously could be forwarded when the student enters the program again. A proper technical support system will be developed for ABC monitoring. The academic methodology of the college is student driven where the resources' instructive methodologies are constructive, request based, intelligent, cooperative and integrative. Summative and Developmental appraisals and tasks are utilized to assess the students learning result.

17.Skill development:

Our college agrees with the National Education Policy's vision to provide high-quality education to help our nation's human resources become global citizens. According to UGC CBCS rules, the college offers Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) in each subject. The Career Advancement Centre of the College also offers a wide range of short-term, non-credit, value-added courses to improve employability. The college puts on a lot of seminars, workshops, and talks by industry experts and scholars to help its stakeholders improve their knowledge and capacity. The College has an active Placement Cell "Career Advancement Centre" for giving vocation direction and open positions. The college has business fair consistently and assortment of mindfulness drives for students to be familiar with the government and private sector jobs. Mentoring students is also one of the practices of the college, to enable students to explore future employment pathways after graduation, and help them get the most of their studies.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The College adopts the Indian Knowledge System to enrich its existing curriculum and is committed towards promoting multilingualism and integration of traditional and modern knowledge systems. The College follows a bilingual model of teaching and our faculty is fluent in both Bengali and English. Among all the programmes offered by the college, the BA Programme offers a broad spectrum of subject combinations with Indian languages. In addition, we offer three modern Indian languages—Hindi, Sanskrit, and Bengali—as discipline courses to BA program participants to promote Indian languages. For

postgraduate studies, Sanskrit and Bengali are also available. The Department of Sanskrit has held numerous webinars, workshops, and conferences to emphasize Sanskrit's significance, which has been a defining aspect of our efforts. Another notable inclusion in the LOCF curriculum is the elective course offered by the Department of Botany titled 'Ethnobotany' which provides students an opportunity to understand the usefulness of the natural products, and their efficient use by local communities, food and medicine, and their conservation practices. In order to impart and promote the values of syncretism and cultural diversity, the College celebrates and commemorates all days of national, cultural and social importance. Effective pupil engagement has also been achieved by regular documentary and film screening by various departments on relevant issues. Our College is a Participating Institute (PI) in the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) programme of the Government of India wherein it has adopted five villages; namely Bagdubi Murakata Kankabati Nepura and Lohatikri with the aim to contribute towards rural development. Moreover, the NSS of the college has adopted the four villages Nichu Gope, Taldanga, Muradanga and Delua and is constantly performing health-check up, sanitation drives, blood donation camps, plantation drives etc. It is standard procedure at the college that all NSS activities in the adopted villages must be carried out in the local Bengali language in order to promote and integrate the local language, art, and culture. The college has also installed indigenously built water filter system for drinking purposes in the primary schools of Muradanga, Murakata and Nepura.

In the various cultural programs organized at Vidysagar University level our students are actively participating in various cultural events and received prizes. Especially our college Annual Magazine, "Sanhita"; published wherein features are published in four languages namely English, Bengali, Hindi, and Sanskrit. As most of our students are from rural areas of "Jungle Mahal" region they can share their thoughts in any language.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The College believes in Outcome Based Education (OBE) to augment the excellence of teaching-learning and instill professionalism in our students. It obeys to the Learning Outcomes - based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) system. In fact, our faculty members have been dynamically engaged in the framing of the LOCF curriculum and have provided valuable inputs towards the same. Further, to realize the objectives of NEP, additionally, the

faculty has actively participated in the conceptualization, reorganization, and improvement of Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF) and adopts multidisciplinary pedagogy through their respective Board of Studies [BOS].

The college is already employing learning process like lectures, seminars, tutorials/workshop/practical and project-based learning field work, technology enabled learning internship and apprenticeship and research work is wherever possible. All the programmes are offered as outcomes-based education (OBE) which are designed keeping in mind the regional and global necessities. Course outcome of every subject is well defined in the curriculum and it is uploaded in the website. The Institute has implemented outcome-based education with clearly stated Programme Outcomes, Programme Specific Outcomes and course outcomes from 2019-20 onwards. All courses are designed with outcomes centred on cognitive abilities namely Remembering, Understanding, Applying, Analysing, Evaluating and Creating. Apart from the domain-specific skills, learning outcomes at all levels guarantee social responsiveness and ethics, as well as entrepreneurial skills so that student contribute proactively to economic, environmental and social well-being of the nation. The Course Objectives (COs) are also aligned to the PO-PSO philosophy. The College also makes an effort to recognize that the quest of knowledge is a life-long activity and to attain positive attitude and other qualities which will lead students to a successful life. To interpret, analyze, evaluate and develop responsibility and effective citizenship is one of the programme outcome of the students.

20.Distance education/online education:

During the pandemic, Raja Narendralal Khan Women's College [Autonomous] impeccably implemented online pedagogy amidst new changing circumstances by using various forms of education new technologies. During the pandemic, faculty and students were able to connect effectively and organize online classes, lectures, meetings, webinars, and other events through the use of online platforms like Zoom, Google Meet, and Microsoft Teams, among others. The college is now equipped, especially during COVID-19 pandemic situations and teaching learning process through diverse online modes likewise App, Google Class rooms, WhatsApp etc. The whole college campus is Wi-Fi enabled with LCD Projectors installed in most of the classrooms and hence no difficulty

/hurdle in online education. Post-pandemic, the online learning experience has been adopted by the faculty and students to full advantage of flexible blended mode of teaching learning. From 2020 onwards departments are exclusively using Microsoft Teams and Google Classroom for sharing learning contents with students for most of the subjects / courses. The faculty members also prepared themselves by getting trained for using various MOOCs and other online platform for online teaching learning through FDP, STTP and workshops during lockdown period. During Covid -19 pandemic various programs, meetings, seminars for students/faculties/research scholars were also organized by the college via online platform conducting conferences and meetings. Keeping in view the convenience of the student, the various technological tools used by the faculties especially during the pandemic lockdown are Google Classroom, Zoom, Google, Microsoft Teams using videos as teaching and learning aids, Group collaboration and interaction and assignment and revision as well as the assessments have been conducted are some of the institutional efforts towards blended learning.

The surplus amount is ploughed back into college accounts for providing high quality academic amenities, state-of-the-art infrastructure and welfare measures.

- **Solid waste management:** The vegetable wastes generated in the kitchen are regularly collected and put in a large compost pit built near the kitchen of the hostel to produce organic manure. Zero littering in the college campus is being practiced by encouraging the use of jute and paper bags; through awareness campaigns and by placing waste-bins at strategic points for use.
- **Liquid waste management:** As the college is located in rural un-sewered area, waste water generated from the sanitary facilities and laboratories is disposed off into septic tanks and their effluents combined with canteen waste water is used for gardening, watering trees etc. The excess wastewater will be directed into natural drain

passing nearby the college campus.

- **E-waste management:** E-waste is created after the end of its useful life and is disposed of through vendors.
- **Biomedical waste management:** Wastes from medical supplies like plastic disposables, liquid waste and other things are collected, kept in a storage and are finally sent for the treatment of the disposal.
- **Waste recycling system:** The NSS volunteers collected unused sheets available on the campus to make notebooks. Recycling the huge amount of waste paper generated in different departments has been proposed.
