Annexure ii: Feedback analysis

Providing a unique learning environment

Providing students access to computers and internet on all days with special coaching for competitive examination, Spoken English and computer training. Career counselling, Psychological counselling and scholarship help desk run by the college.

Details-

Raja Narendra Lal Khan Women's College is a rural college situated in the backward district of Paschim Medinipore having nearly 70% rural students and more than 45% students belonging to the backward communities. Our college is still the only women's college in the district attracting many first generation learners. The pivotal aim of this college is to empower women of this backward area by educating them and allowing them to become self reliant. This would have a positive impact on the society as a whole.

Creating a unique environment: The campus area of the college is 46.26 acres covered by lush green vegetation. Our campus has nearly thousand species of plants and attracts many species of birds among other animals. The college administrative building which was built during 1890's has been declared as a heritage building by W.B Heritage Commission. The unique environment of our college creates a unique ambience for learners as well as for the teachers.

The relationship between the teacher and the taught: The relationship between the teacher and taught is not confined in classroom teaching.
